Materials	Handout: Community Awareness: Social Agencies and what they do, Pen or pencil, computer and Internet access or brochures from various agencies		
Activities	 Discuss with students some of the problems they or someone they know might have had e.g. no food, need a dentist, legal help. Explain that in the U.S. there are a lot of organizations that can help. Have Ss find a partner and then pass out the handout. Using a computer, explain to Ss that they will use the Google search engine to locate the agencies listed on the bottom and find out what services they offer. Once they find an agency, they need to scan the "programs" or "services" section of the website. Based on what they learn they will put the name of the agency under the appropriate problem. If no computers are available, have Ss scan a variety of local social agency brochures to complete the handout. 		
Assessment/ Evidence Reflection	Students will complete the activity sheet with 80% correct. They will also use the information to help themselves or others. This is the second time I attempted this lesson. I think it worked better because I had them work with a partner. Also, I simplified the handout and limited the number of agencies for them to consider.
