	Pass out the labels map of the US Do a" listen and repeat" to practice pronouncing the 50 states of the United						

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

	Students (either alone or with a partner) will then use their labeled maps to complete the USA MAP ACTIVITY handout. The class will share the results of this activity.
Assessment /Evidence	Students will label as many of the states as they can.
Reflection	It is very important to be aware of the location of other states within the US, especially when persons are new to this country. Opportunities may occur that warrant the need to know the location of other states; such opportunities may include, job opportunities, vacation locations, and the like.
