Community Resources - Obtaining a Driver's License in the State of Ohio

Step One: Open Internet Explorer on the computer. Go to www.google.com and type "Ohio BMV" in the search bar. Click "Google Search". Look for the website address of Ohio BMV and click on it.

Step Two: Roll the pointer over "Driver Licensing". Using the pop-up menu find the answers to the following questions.

- 1. What do you need a primary and secondary document for?
- 2. What things can you use as a primary or secondary document?
- 3. How much is a temporary permit packet?
- 4. How much will it cost you to get your first driver's license?
- 5. How many people are on file in Ohio as organ donors on their driver's licenses?
- 6. What can you show as proof of financial responsibility in terms of insurance?

Step Three: Find the address of a branch office of the Ohio BMV near your home or our school where you can accomplish driver licensing. Record the address.

Step Four: Go to www.google.com and click on "Maps." Enter the address you just recorded. Confirm the location and print the map and directions.
